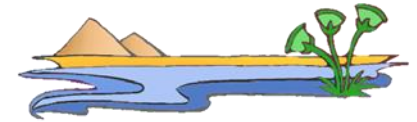

	<p><u>Soldiers</u></p> <p>Soldiers (<i>to guard</i>) the country from its enemies. They (<i>to be</i>) extremely brave and heroic and (<i>to be</i>) often (<i>to reward</i>) with land and riches.</p>
	<p><u>Craftsmen</u></p> <p>Craftsmen (<i>to be</i>) very skilled labourers. They (<i>to make</i>) pottery, woven items, jewellery, shoes, clothes, statues and items with leather.</p>
	<p><u>Farmers</u></p> <p>Farmers (<i>to do</i>) not own their own land; instead they (<i>to farm</i>) the land that (<i>to belong</i>) to the pharaoh, nobles and other rich Egyptians in return for food clothes and a home. They (<i>to pay</i>) rent to the landowner from the money they (<i>to make</i>) from their crops. Most Egyptians (<i>to be</i>) farmers.</p>
	<p><u>Slaves</u></p> <p>Slaves (<i>to be</i>) usually prisoners from wars, therefore often (<i>to be</i>) not Egyptians. They (<i>to work</i>) in the homes of the pharaoh and rich families. They (<i>to be</i>) (<i>to kill</i>) with their master to take care of them in the afterlife. They (<i>to have</i>) no rights and no property of their own.</p>
