



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# Science Years 1 and 2


To identify the properties of particular materials

5. Place each item overlapping on the edge of a table. If you press on it, does it bend or not?
6. Record your results - you can choose if you write full sentences or record it with diagrams. Which material is the most rigid? Which material is the most flexible?

## Which materials are magnetic?




1. If you can, find a magnet (you might have one on your fridge!)
