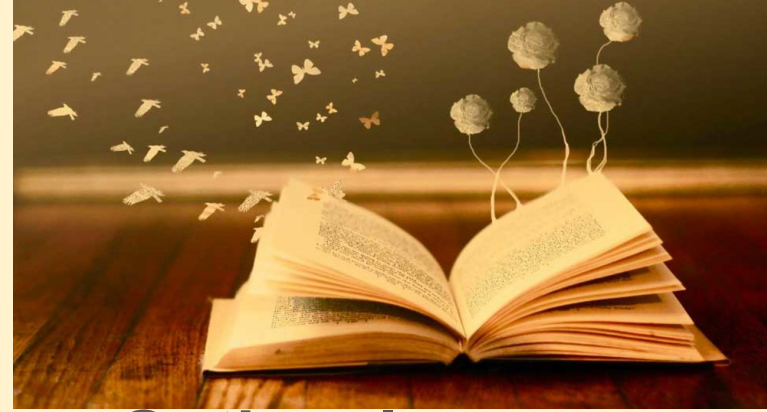

Art and Computing

Our focus last term had been on drawings linked to stone age animals.

Today, we will create our own *static* digital [cave painting](#) collage.

Ideally, use your own cave drawings (take a photo, upload to your device, upload to [SCRATCH](#) as a SPRITE)

Or

Take a screenshot from your device and save to photos and use this instead (SNIP tool on laptop - Windows + shift + S) in SCRATCH

For your backdrop, think about a cave interior and use the PAINT feature.

Screen free Art

Draw your own kangaroo in the style of the 17, 300 year old example!

Create a salt dough cave surface and carve your own cave symbols (use your ideas from last term)

Prep 10 minutes

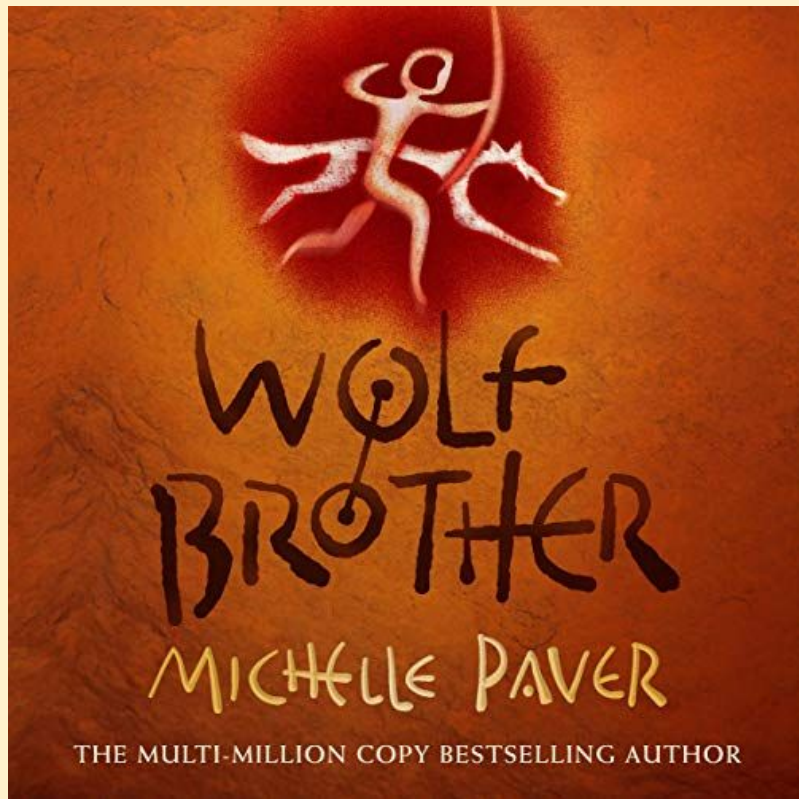
Cook 3 hours

- 1 cupful of plain flour (about 250g)
- half a cupful of table salt (about 125g)
- half a cupful of water (about 125ml)

Method

Mix the flour and salt together in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball. A drier dough will hold its shape better when you sculpt, but it will take a bit more work to squish together initially into a smooth dough ball. Add the water a bit at a time so you have control over this! Flatten and carve your own cave art on lined greaseproof paper, place it on a lined baking tray (if not on the paper already) and cook in a preheated oven at around 100 degrees for about 3 hours.

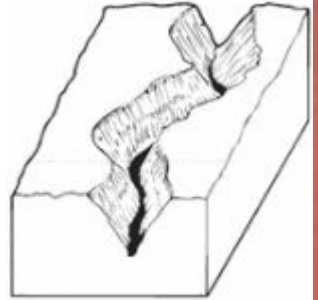
